Black Dawg Farm Sanctuary

"We kept getting calls from folks that had animals they knew of that were in dire situations, had been altogether abandoned or their owners had circumstances that forced them to relinquish said animals. We kept opening up our arms and gathering these lost souls into our little farm."

Black Dawg started with informal rescues of several horses and goats from dire circumstances. Now, the sanctuary is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit and home to chickens, ducks, turkeys, rabbits, dogs, goats, sheep, alpacas, pigs, horses, ponies, donkeys, and a mule.

SAFE's greatest needs:

- 1) Large Rubbermaid farm carts
- 2) 55-75 gallon plastic water troughs
- 3) Gravel
- 4) A permanent home (SAFE leases their property)



Save a Forgotten Equine (SAFE) is a non-profit horse rescue. Since 2005 their mission has been to rescue, rehabilitate, retrain, and rehome horses facing abuse and neglect. They primarily support local animal control agencies with horse that have been seized from their owners, but they also take owner surrenders as they have space available.

We are highly trained and experienced in search and rescue efforts; field triage, evacuation and transport of animals affected by disaster. We also assist in temporary sheltering and re-homing efforts if necessary."

Joplin's has transitioned from a sanctuary to a rescue model. They do the technical work of animal rescue (i.e. search/rescue, evacuation, field triage, and assisting with temporary sheltering and transport) and then work with a potential network of foster/adoptive homes and other rescues to provide long term housing or permanent homes.

"Every new animal rescued who gets to live out their happy best life reignites that commitment to rescue as many animals as we can."



Closed to the public Committed volunteers welcome Chimpanzee Sanctuary Northwest was founded in 2003 and originally built with volunteer labor. The first group of chimpanzees arrived in 2008 after decades of use in biomedical testing and breeding. Three additional chimpanzees arrived in 2019 from a refuge in California that shuttered after 40 years. The Sanctuary is also home to four cattle.

"Our greatest challenge is finding good forever homes for all of the wonderful goats we rescue. we take in over 200 goats per year and our goal is to find homes for all so we can continue to rescue more."

Puget Sound Goat Rescue was established after someone gave two goats, found abandoned and tied to a post in the rain, to a friend. PSGR's founder fell in love, and the operation grew to include rescue of goats destined for human consumption via local livestock auctions. Five years ago, PSGR bought a second farm to accommodate the enormous need to provide goats a safe haven.

She especially saw that roosters were the ultimate underdogs. This led to Rooster Haus Rescue being founded in 2016, inspired by a surviving rooster from a 600 bird bust of an illegal cockfighting ring.
